Part1: Attractively Exciting Booths (10:00-18:00)

Part2: Sports Exchanges (Japanese Martial Arts) Karate Demonstration by Bhutan Karate Association

Bhutan Karate Association is the sole organization promoting karate sports in the country since 2009. Today, Bhutan Karate Association has more than 10,000 karate members, 20 qualified referees and judges from 32 affiliated clubs from 9 districts. The association was introduced with the objective to promote karate sports in the country as well as to help our youth to secure and build a better future for enthusiast karate lovers in the country.



Some of the recent achievements of Bhutan Karate Association is the participation in the 5th South Asian Karate Championship held at Bangladesh and the participation in the 13th South Asian Games held at Nepal, where we were able to secure medals. On top of that the BKA will also feature in the upcoming Asian Games to be held in China 2023 for the first time.

Judo Demonstration by Bhutan Judo Association

Judo was first introduced in Bhutan in 2010 by the Pelkhil Judo Club and later renamed Bhutan Judo Association after receiving affiliation from Bhutan Olympic Committee. BJA is now a member of Judo Union of Asia (JUA) and International Judo Federation (IJF). BJA runs 2 clubs in Thimphu, at Pelkhil School and at Zilnon Namgyelling School. At Pelkhil Dojo, membership is open to all. BJA is ready to open more clubs if suitable locations are available.



BJA hosts the Bhutanese national Judo team which has represented Bhutan at the South Asian Games (2016, 2019), World Championships Tokyo 2019, Tokyo 2020 etc. BJA members have so far won 4 international bronze medals. BJA has also been selected to represent Bhutan at the Asian Games 2023 in Hangzhou, China and at the South Asian Games 2023 in Pakistan.

Part3: Music Performance from Japanese Anime, Naruto

Japanese animation is very popular all over the world and Bhutan is no exception. Many Bhutanese children are fond of Naruto, One-Piece & Attack on Titans. This time, Pelkhil School will present 'Blue Bird' from Naruto with recorders. Enjoy our performance and let's sing together!!

MINI JAPAN ANIME FILM FESTIVAL

The Film Festival will feature on animation films directed by Makoto SHINKAI, who is a well-known Japanese director, animator, cinematographer and manga artist. Mr. SHINKAI was born in Nagano, Japan in 1973. He made his commercial debut in 2002 the short film he produced on his own, "Voices of a Distant Star." He subsequently released "The Place Promised in Our Early Days" (2004), "5 Centimeters Per Second" (2007), "Children Who Chase Lost Voices" (2011) and "The Garden of Words" (2013). The 2016 release of "Your Name" was a blockbuster hit that caused a social phenomenon, and "Weathering With You," released in 2019, was the highest-grossing film at the domestic box office in the same year, receiving high acclaim and attention both in Japan and abroad.

The Garden of Words (2013/46 min)


