

# The JET Programme 2025 Applications open this September!!

The Japan Exchange and Teaching (JET) Programme started in 1987 with the aim of promoting grassroots international exchange between Japan and other countries. So far, there have been more than 77,000 participants from 78 countries around the world. The JET programme is implemented by the Japanese government and Japanese local authorities.

## Job position

### Assistant Language Teacher (ALT)

Participants employed as **ALTs** are placed in schools or local boards of education. ALTs assist Japanese teachers with English lessons and are thus involved in the preparation of teaching materials and in extra curricular activities such as English clubs.

## Eligibility

- Hold at least a **Bachelor's degree or obtain such qualifications by the designated arrival date** in July/August.
- Be an Indian citizen.
- Have **excellent English skills** (written and spoken).
- Be both mentally and physically healthy.
- Not have lived in Japan for six or more years in total in the past ten years.
- Have a keen interest in Japan and be willing to deepen their knowledge and appreciation of Japan.

## General Conditions

### (1) Period of Participation

– In principle, participation is for a **one-year period** starting from the day after arrival in Japan and **may extend up to 3 years** or in exceptional cases **to a total of 5 years**.

### (2) Work Hours

– 35 hours per week, standard (typically Monday to Friday)

### (3) Holidays

– Saturday, Sunday, Japanese national holidays, paid leave (at least 10 days)\*

\* Due to work circumstances, participants may be asked to work during weekends and national holidays.

### (4) Remuneration

– Participants receive a remuneration of approximately **3.36 million yen (approx. 17.9 lakh)** for their first year of appointment. Remuneration increases with subsequent appointments.

### (5) Assignment

– Participants are assigned to local government organisations and schools **throughout Japan**. Although placement requests are possible, they are not guaranteed.
